(From the sermon “Two Debtors” preached by Charles Spurgeon)

Luke 7: 37 And, behold, a woman in the city, which was a sinner, when she knew that Jesus sat at meat in the Pharisee’s house, brought an alabaster box of ointment, 38: And stood at his feet behind him weeping...

Our Lord was reclining at his meal, and his feet were turned towards the door, so that she did not have to come far into the house before she reached his feet; and there she stood, “*at his feet.*” Those are blessed words: “*at his feet.*” That is the place where we also would stand and weep. That is the place where we would sit and learn. That is the place where we would wait and serve. That is the place where we hope to live and reign for ever: “*at his feet.*”

LIKE A CHILD

A KEY CALLED PROMISE

In Pilgrim's Progress when Christian and Hopeful were cast into the dungeon of despair in Doubting Castle under the captivity of the giant, after a long time broken and beaten in that dungeon, Christian broke out in “a passionate speech.” He said, “[Why] am I, thus to lie in a stinking dungeon when I may as well walk at liberty! I have a key in my bosom, called Promise, that will, I am persuaded, open any lock in Doubting Castle. Then said Hopeful that's good news: good brother, pluck it out of thy bosom, and try.” Of course, the key opened the door and they walked free.

Brethren, when we are in that dungeon of despair remember, we have a key called Promise—God's everlasting covenant promise. David's last words were, “*Although my house be not so with God; yet he hath made with me an everlasting covenant, ordered in all things, and sure: for this is all my salvation, and all my desire, although he make it not to grow.*” (2 Sa 23:5) That is the key called Promise that will open any lock in Doubting Castle!
